### At St. Paul, Preble

**November Newsletter** with the month's acolyte rotation is in narthex.

**All Saints' Day.** The Feast of All Saints was Friday Nov. 1, but we transfer it to the nearest Sunday in November that we might celebrate it together as a congregation. On All Saints, we remember the Church Triumphant – those saints in heaven, whose bodies have been laid to rest, and whose souls are with the Lord. These saints enjoy the Sabbath rest of God (Heb. 4:9). As the First Reading from Revelation 7 tells us, they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. They are the “host arrayed in white” as we shall sing in our Hymn of the Day. Free of the stain of sin and every source of temptation, “they are before the throne of God, and serve him day and night in his temple.” Their one joy and delight is to worship the Lamb before his throne, and, with palm branches in their hands, they sing together one unending chorus, “Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!” [Rev.7] In his Beatitudes, our Lord promises the Church on earth, which does battle against Satan, world, and flesh and so often finds itself weak and suffering, the unending blessedness of the future life of the world to come.

The Church on earth and the Church in heaven is one Church. Though we have been separated from our departed brothers and sisters by

death, we are in communion with them when we receive the Body and Blood of Christ in the Lord's Supper. In the Lord's Supper, heaven joins earth, and together with the angels, archangels, and all the company of heaven, we worship God and the Lamb. Jesus feeds us of his own Body and Blood, so that, in perfect communion with him and with all his saints, we may share in the hope of eternal life.
