NEWS AND NOTES, November 17th, 2019

At St. Paul, Preble

Today's sermon is a meditation on the Gospel from <u>Luke 21:5-28</u>. The Church is living in the End Times, the period of time between Christ's first coming in humility and his second coming in glory. Jesus came to this earth first under weakness, born of a Virgin, to suffer under Pontius Pilate and die on a cross to pay for the sins of the world. He leaves this world at his Ascension with the promise that he is coming again to judge the living and the dead. When the Lord Jesus comes again, it will not be like his first coming in humility, but a coming in power: Jesus says in today's Gospel from **Luke 21:5-28**, "They will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory." [V27]

The Church on earth is a waiting Church. The Church waits in patience for the Second Coming of Jesus. When the Lord returns, as we confess in the Catechism, he will "raise me and all the dead and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ." Though our bodies will eventually die and be buried in the ground, we look forward to that great Day when the Lord will come again to give life to our mortal bodies, and he will swallow up death forever. So we wait for the Second Coming of the Lord with great hope and confidence.

The End Times are for the world, a time for fear and trembling. The Lord speaks of disasters both natural and manmade, as signs of the end. Persecution and false teachers will beset the Church. Even still for Christians, the End Times are a time of patient confidence and joy. When we see calamities happening all around us, we remember our Lord's promise that he is coming soon. And that promise is the Church's joyful hope. We know that Christ is preparing for us a New Heaven and a New Earth which will never pass away. And when he comes again, we will share with all the saints in that blessed future—the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.
