# At St. Paul, Preble

**Today**, Sunday Nov. 24, marks the Last Sunday of the Church Year. As always, the Last Sunday gives us a picture of the Last Judgment. Sheep and Goats are separated on Christ's right and left; the goats go to eternal judgment, but the sheep to eternal life. Our reading for this Sunday is from <u>Lk. 23:27-43</u>, an excerpt from the Passion of our Lord from St. Luke's account, which has our Lord between two thieves.

As it is for the sheep and the goats, so it is for the thieves: the thief on the left receives our Lord with scorn, the thief on the right with repentance and faith. "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom," is the repentant thief's prayer to our Lord. And to him, Christ makes the sweet promise, "Today you will be with me in paradise." This teaches that the Final Judgment will be a winnowing of faith and unbelief. The kingdom of heaven is not earned by works, but given by grace alone to those unworthy and undeserving human beings, who by the power of the Spirit at work through his Word, learn to forsake themselves, turn from sin, and look to Christ for the forgiveness he purchased for the world at the cost of his own blood.
