NEWS AND NOTES, January 19th, 2020

At St. Paul, Preble

The Second Sunday of Epiphany gives us the Holy Gospel from <u>St. John 1:29-42a</u>. John the Baptist witnesses to Jesus as the Lamb of God, the atoning sacrifice who bears the sins of all mankind. Once Jesus' ministry begins, John's ministry has served its purpose and must come to a close—"he must increase," John says about his younger cousin, "and I must decrease." Two of John's disciples, one of whom is named Andrew, follow Jesus, and brings his brother Peter to Jesus.

While Peter becomes the spokesman for the Apostles and receives credit for his confession of Jesus as the Christ (Mt. 16:16), Andrew is the first Apostle of our Lord, and the first to call Jesus Messiah. Like John the Baptist, Andrew proves to be a faithful witness to Christ. He brings the boy with the five loaves and two fish to Jesus (Jn. 6:9) and later, expedites a meeting between Jesus and the Greeks (Jn. 12:20-22). Like Andrew, we are witnesses to Christ by bringing friends and family to meet him where he comes to us in Word and Sacrament.
