At St. Paul, Preble

The Transfiguration of Our Lord is celebrated today. The text for our meditation is Matthew 17:1-9. Jesus takes three disciples up a mountain and is transfigured before them. His appearance changes. His ordinary raiment shines dazzling white. The glory of the divinity shines through the humanity of Jesus. For one brief moment, the disciples of Jesus see their Lord with the cloak of his humility pulled back. They behold him as the angels and saints in eternal glory behold the Son of God, and they are utterly astonished.

With Jesus are Moses and Elijah. The Law and Prophets. All of Scripture bears witness to Jesus. They discuss with the Lord "his exodus," St. Luke says. That means his cross. What is the conversation of heaven? What fills the saints in glory with delight? It is nothing else than the gospel of Christ crucified for sinners. The saints glory eternally in that sacrificial death, for it is the moment of Satan's undoing. It is the moment of our salvation.

St. Peter wants to stay on that mountain. The glory of Jesus is a blessed sight. He doesn't want to journey below where sin and darkness await them. But the Father rebukes Peter: "This is my Son; listen to him." Christ must go to the cross, as he says three times before his death, to save the world. With this heavenly vision, the Church sees a picture (a "type," as the Hymn of the Day says), of her own blessed future. When Christ comes again to raise the dead, we will appear with him in such glory. This experience will be joyful beyond all telling. For now, the whole creation awaits the revealing of the sons of God even as we pray for the same, "Come soon, Lord Jesus."

This morning we rejoice to have Pr. Brege present with us to celebrate and teach. His plan is to present on his recent trip to Israel with Lynn in the Bible Class, complete with pictures. Please join us for Bible Class.

The Season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, Feb. 26th at 7pm. We will gather for Lenten midweek services Wednesday at 7 o'clock.
