Romans 7:14–25a

Distribution Hymn | 622 Lord Jesus Christ, You Have Prepared





# THE WORD of GOD for TODAY

There is a beautiful connection between today's Epistle and Holy Gospel. In Romans 7:14-25, St. Paul talks about the struggle that every Christian knows and experiences in his or her own life: the struggle with indwelling sin. Christians are those who have been redeemed by the Blood of Christ, set free from sin and death in Baptism, reclaimed by the Holy Spirit to a new life abounding with faith and good works—and yet the sin from which we have been released is still there is our flesh, leading us to do the very evil things we do not want to do. In fact, the Christian will never be totally purged of sin until death. And so the greatest struggle of the Christian life is this: experiencing the corruption of our own flesh, which manifests itself in all sorts of evil thoughts, desires, and actions. As redeemed people of faith, we learn to hate and abhor such evil when we find it in ourselves. The struggle with ongoing sin leads to Paul's exasperated cry: "O wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from this body of death?"

In today's Gospel, Jesus offers the gift of rest. Matthew 11:28 is a verse well-known. It is our Lord's sweet Gospel invitation: "Come to me, all you who are weary and heavy laden and I will give you rest." There are different kinds of weariness, just as there are different kinds of rest. To the woman at the well, weary with sadness over her past life, Christ offers the rest of living water. To the hungry multitudes in the wilderness, Christ offers the rest of food in a meal of bread and fish multiplied. St. John on Maundy Thursday found literal 'rest' in the lap of Jesus. Christ satisfies all human weariness of both body and soul. But the greatest weariness of all is the ongoing and persistent struggle with one's own sin and inner wretchedness. Therefore the greatest rest of all is the consolation and peace of conscience that comes through the forgiveness of sins which Christ offers to every sinner. When Christ bids sinners to come to him and find rest, he is offering us forgiveness for all our past failures and shortcomings. He is offering us a fresh start and a new birth. He is offering us his own righteousness and holiness by which we

stand justified before God, and through which we are renewed to faith, love, and good works. This rest, Christ offers you today in his Word and Blessed Sacrament.

There is no dismissal of each individual or couple; the dismissal is spoken over the entire congregation at the end of the Sacrament. After having received the Body and Blood of Christ, please return to your pew by the side aisle. The common cup is withheld for a time, so take an individual cup provided on the stand with you up to the altar. You may receive the Body of Christ with an open mouth or an open hand.

**Services at Adams Woodcrest.** Thanks be to God, the staff at Woodcrest is working with the pastors of the Decatur circuit to facilitate Divine Services for our members to be held outside. Wednesday Evening Bible Class and Compline. Pr. Yeager has begun a Bible Class for Wednesday evenings at 6pm. The first class met Wednesday, June 10<sup>th</sup>. We will study the Book of 2 Corinthians for an hour and at the end of the study, we will learn and pray the Office of Compline in the sanctuary, which is a prayer office for the close of the day (LSB 253). Compline should take no longer than 15 minutes. If you plan to come, please let Pr. Yeager know of your intentions and bring your own Bible from home so that you can take notes.
